CITY PURCHASES FOUR NEW MEDI-RIDE VEHICLES

The City recently purchased four new Medi-Ride vehicles to replace the Medi-Ride vans the City acquired in 2002. The new vehicles were purchased using Federal Transportation Administration funds in conjunction with local transit funds to cover a local matching contribution for the City.

"The technology on these new Medi-Ride vans is a lot newer so they are more fuel efficient and produce fewer emissions," said Acting Director of Transportation Claude McFerguson.

In addition to being environmentally friendly, the new vehicles seat 12 people, two more than the vans they replace, and feature a new braking technology that will reduce wear and tear on the vehicle, as well as maintenance costs. The vehicles also have accommodations for disabled passengers, which in-

cludes a motorized platform wheelchair ramp capable of safely lifting the large scooter style wheelchairs.

The vehicles also have a number of advanced safety features including emergency exit lights and overhead hand rails.

The vans were manufactured using an exclusive "Steel-Safe" construction technology that wraps passengers in a welded steel safety cage with a steel exterior skin to provide maximum strength, rigidity and structural integrity to better protect passengers in the event of an accident.

The new replacement buses were purchased through the A-Z Bus Sales cooperative. Purchases made through the cooperative save the City the time and expense of going out to bid.

The purchase process was conducted through the California Association for Coordinated Transportation (CalACT), which complies with all Federal and State procurement regulations. The total purchase price was \$500,000.

The Commerce Medi-Ride program is free to all city residents with a disability and for seniors, 50 years of age or older.

The City's Medi-Ride service is provided on a "curb-to-curb" basis.

The service is available Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. for trips within a 12-mile radius of City Hall.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE



The Commerce Library is encouraging Commerce residents who are currently enrolled in college or will be attending an accredited college or university this fall to apply for a 2011 Commerce Scholarship.

The Scholarship is open to undergraduates carrying 12 or more units (full-time status) and post graduates meeting all eligibility requirements.

Last year the City awarded fifty-two scholarships totaling \$81,000 to Commerce residents through the Commerce Scholarship Program.

The City's 2010 Year End Report is now available for public review. The report is a record of the City's major projects, services and accomplishments. It includes information about each City department and a summary of the City's general operating budget. Copies of the Year End Report will be available to the public online at ci.commerce.ca.us and at each branch of the Commerce Public Library and at City Hall.

With the state budget deficit now exceeding \$25 billion, the state's fiscal crisis continues to deteriorate. Governor Brown and the Legislature must deal with the never ending state budget deficit problem. However, the Governor's proposal to eliminate redevelopment agencies is a step in the wrong direction and would be devastating to underserved cities like the City of Commerce. Eliminating redevelopment funding would force substantial program and service cuts at the local level and would cost California thousands of jobs. Redevelopment is a local tool for promoting private investment. It is an economic engine intended to improve communities stimulating job growth, new construction and housing. It's not clear if the Governor's proposal would withstand a legal challenge (Prop. 22 prohibits raiding local redevelopment agencies) or get the support of the legislature, but it will hurt California's economy.

Recently the City adopted an ordinance that establishes regulations for the use of canopies on residential properties. Each household can purchase a permit for \$50 that will allow a canopy to be used on that property for a period of 90 days. Copies of the new ordinance are being distributed to all City households. The City has also revised the Commerce Municipal Code to discourage fraudulent access and misuse of Commerce resident activity cards. These changes are designed to discourage potential impacts on Commerce programs and services that are caused by activity card fraud. For more on this see the story on page 2.

If you are a Commerce resident currently enrolled in college or will be attending an accredited college or university this fall, we encourage you to fill out an application for the 2011 Commerce Scholarship Program. This will be the first year that the application is available exclusively online via the City's website at www.ci.commerce.ca.us/ or the Commerce Library's website at www.cocpl.org.

Remember to vote in the Tuesday, March 8 General Municipal Election. For more information about the election see the City Clerk's article on page 7 of this issue. Voting is one of the most important things you can do to ensure your voice in government and in our democracy.

And lastly, City Hall and the Commerce libraries will be closed on Friday, February 11 and Monday, February 22 in observance of President Lincoln's and President Washington's birthdays. Happy Valentine's Day!

MUNICIPAL NOTES

Fraudulent Resident Card Penalties Approved

To control fraudulent access and misuse of Commerce resident activity cards, the City Council approved revisions to the Commerce Municipal Code that include penalties for individuals who obtain or assist others in fraudulently attaining activity cards. Penalties include the revocation of activity cards for one year and repayment for City services obtained using the fraudulent card. The new revisions also make it illegal for Commerce residents to knowingly allow others to use their address to fraudulently establish residency and/or obtain a resident card. In addition to the penalties, anyone who violates these statutes will be subject to prosecution.

The City will send individuals suspected of using a fraudulent card a letter asking the activity card holder to re-verify their Commerce residency.

These changes will discourage activity card fraud and protect resident programs and services while allowing staff to thoroughly screen resident card applications.

FINANCIAL AID HELP FOR COMMERCE COLLEGE STUDENTS

Commerce Library volunteer Evelyn Diaz is volunteering to help students and their parents identify and apply for financial aid opportunities like the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) application to help the students pay their college tuition.

"A lack of money shouldn't be an obstacle to getting an education," said Diaz who is a college counselor at Huntington Park High School (HPHS) and is currently working on her teaching credential and Master's Degree at Cal State Long Beach.

A 2010 Commerce Scholarship recipient, Diaz grew up

in Commerce and participated in many City programs including sports and dance. Having benefitted from these programs she wants to reciprocate. "I'm now at a stage in my career where I've got more stability so I wanted to give back some of the support I was fortunate enough to receive," said Diaz.

After approaching Commerce Scholarship Coordinator Beatriz Sarmiento last fall, Diaz started helping local high school students fill out college applications.

Now Diaz, who has worked extensively with low income and first generation college bound students, is helping Commerce residents with financial aid forms like the FAFSA application.

APPLICATIONS FOR VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS AND RETURN OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS

City Clerk Linda Kay Olivieri has announced the following information relating to applications for vote by mail ballots and the return of vote by mail ballots for the March 8, 2011, General Municipal Election to be held in the City of Commerce:

Registered voters in the City may request in writing a vote by mail ballot from the City Clerk's Office between February 7 and March 1, 2011. You may also come by the City Clerk's Office between these dates, complete an application and vote in person. Applications submitted prior to this time will be held until February 7.

The City Clerk's Office cannot accept any applications received less than seven days prior to the election, unless you become ill or disabled or for some unforeseen reason will be away from your polling place on election day.

Applications are available at the City Clerk's Office and are included with the Sample Ballot and Voter Information Pamphlet.

Applications may also be provided by individuals, candidates, committees, organizations or groups. These applications must be of a uniform format as provided by law and must include on it the name, address and telephone number of who provided it to the voter. These applications may not be forwarded to the voter.

Your application must include your printed name, residence address, the address you want the vote by mail ballot sent to (personally filled in by you) and the name and date of the election you are applying for. In addition, you must personally date and sign your application.

Even if requested by you, your vote by mail ballot will not be sent to a candidate's residence, campaign headquarters or political party, unless you are the candidate, candidate's spouse or immediate family member or share the same residence address as the candidate.

You have the right to return your application directly to the City Clerk by mail or in person. You do not need to return the application to any other individual, organization or group.

Your vote by mail ballot will be provided directly to you by the City Clerk's Office. Ballots will not be given to any individual, organization or group to deliver to you. If you become ill or disabled or for some unforeseen reason will be away from your polling place between March 2 and March 8, 2011, you may au-

thorize another person to bring you the ballot and return it for you after you have voted.

You must personally return your ballot to the City Clerk's Office by mail or delivery. If ill, or disabled, you may designate a specific relative or person residing in your household to return the ballot for you by completing the required information on the back of the return envelope. You may also return your ballot to any polling place on election day.

IMPORTANT NOTICE: Except as noted above, no other individual, candidate, group or organization is allowed to pick up and mail or deliver your ballot for you. This may prevent your ballot from being counted.

If you are ill, or disabled, the City Clerk's Office will personally send a special Deputy City Clerk to pick up your vote by mail ballot and return it to the City Clerk's Office for you. If you are in need of this service, please call the number listed below.

If you have requested and received a vote by mail ballot and later decide you would like to vote in person at your polling place on election day, please surrender your vote by mail ballot to the election officers at your polling place and they will give you a new ballot to vote at that time.

Further, if you have requested, received and returned a vote by mail ballot and later decide you would like to vote in person at your polling place on election day, or would like to change your vote for any reason, you must personally come in to the City Clerk's Office to submit your request.

The counting of your vote by mail ballot will depend upon the successful processing of your application and your voter registration being verified by the Los Angeles County Registrar's Office. Your signature on the back of the return envelope must match your signature on your approved application.

Please note that vote by mail ballots received after the close of the polls at 8:00 p.m. on March 8, 2011, will not be opened or counted.

La Secretaria Municipal, Linda Kay Olivieri ha anunciado la siguiente información relacionada con las solicitudes para papeletas de voto por correo y el retorno de las papeletas de voto por correo para la Elección Municipal General de la Ciudad de Commerce el 8 de Marzo de 2011.

Votantes registrados en la Ciudad pueden solicitar por escrito una papeleta de voto por correo de la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal del 7 de Febrero al 1 de Marzo de 2011. También pueden recoger y completar la solicitud en persona en la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal. Solicitudes entregadas antes de este periodo de tiempo se guardarán hasta el 7 de Febrero.

La oficina de la Secretaria Municipal no puede aceptar solicitudes recibidas menos de siete días antes de la elección, a menos que se enferman o son incapacitados o por una razón imprevista que lo obliga estar lejos de su centro electoral el día de votar.

Solicitudes con el Folleto de Información y Muestra de la Papeleta están disponibles en la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal.

Solicitudes también pueden ser recibidas de individuos, candidatos, comités, organizaciones, o grupos. Por ley, estas solicitudes están en una forma uniforme y deben de incluir el nombre, dirección y número de teléfono de quien les dio la solicitud. Estas solicitudes no pueden ser remitidas al votante.

Su solicitud debe de incluir su nombre escrita en letra de bloque, domicilio residencial, domicilio donde quiere que se mande la papeleta (completada personalmente por usted) y el nombre y fecha de la elección. Además, debe de personalmente firmar y fechar su solicitud.

Aunque usted lo solicite, la papeleta no será mandada al domicilio de un candidato, oficina de campaña o partido político, a menos que usted es un candidato, esposo del un candidato o su familia directa, o reside usted en el mismo domicilio del candidato.

Es su derecho devolver su solicitud directamente a la Secretaria Municipal por correo o en persona. No tiene que devolver su solicitud a cualquier otro individuo, organización o grupo.

Su papeleta de voto por correo será proveída directamente a usted por parte de la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal. Papeletas de voto no serán entregadas a ningún individuo, organización o grupo para que se le entreguen a usted. Si usted se enferma o esta incapacitado o por alguna razón imprevista no puede ir a su centro electoral entre el 2 de Marzo y el 8 de Marzo de 2011, puede usted autorizar a otra persona para que

le entregue su papeleta y devuelva la misma después que ha votado.

Debe usted personalmente devolver su papeleta a la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal por correo o presentada en persona. Si se encuentra enfermo o incapacitado, puede designar a un miembro de su familia o persona que reside en su hogar para que entregue su papeleta por usted si usted incluye la información requerida en la parte trasera del sobre de retorno. También puede usted devolver su papeleta a cualquier centro electoral en el día de la elección.

NOTA IMPORTANTE: Con la excepción de lo indicado anteriormente, ningún individuo, candidato, grupo o organización es permitida recoger, mandar por correo, o entregar su papeleta por usted. Esto puede prevenir que se cuente su voto.

Si esta usted enfermo o incapacitado, la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal mandará a un Delegado particular de la Secretaria Municipal para recoger su papeleta de voto por correo y entregarlo a la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal. Si requiere este servicio, favor de llamar al número indicado al calce.

Además, si ha solicitado, recibió y devolvió una papeleta de voto por correo y después decide que quiere votar en persona en su centro electoral en el día de la elección, o quiere cambiar su voto por cualquier razón, debe de personalmente presentarse en la oficina de la Secretaria Municipal para presentar su solicitud.

Para que se cuente su papeleta de voto por correo depende de que se procese su solicitud y de que su registro de votante sea verificado por la Oficina del Registro Civil del Condado de Los Angeles. Su firma en la parte trasera del sobre debe de ser igual que su firma en su solicitud de registro.

Favor de notar que las papeletas de voto por correo recibidas después que se cierran las cabinas electorales a las 8:00 p.m. el 8 de Marzo de 2011, no serán abiertas o contadas.

CITY ORDINANCE REGULATING CANOPIES APPROVED

MULTI-DAY PERMITS REQUIRED



In October, the City Council adopted an ordinance regulating the placement of canopy structures on residential properties. The ordinance limits the number of canopies permitted on resi-

dences and requires a permit and fee for structures that will be up for more than 24 hours. Under the ordinance, residents can have one canopy in the rear yard of their residential properties. Canopies are not permitted in front or side yards. Residents who want to keep a canopy up for more than one day must obtain a \$50 permit which allows the structure to be up for a maximum of 90 days. Only one permit will be issued annually.

While the ordinance states that canopies cannot be visible from public view, an exception will be made for owners of corner lots. Staff will provide information about canopy structures to residents over the next couple

of months and all nonconforming canopy structures will be required to be removed by mid February.

Staff reported that use of tents and canopies has increased creating a need for regulation. Officials also reported that improperly placed tents and canopies can be hazardous because structures made with materials that are not fire treated create a fire risk and that light weight structures can blow over or collapse during high winds affecting the property owner and neighboring properties. Aesthetically, tents and canopies may detract from a neighborhood's appearance.
